## Competition Basics

Club Taree Golf regular competitions are set out from page 9. You can find a fully up to date program in the professional's shop and on the Club Taree website, [www.clubtaree.com.au](http://www.clubtaree.com.au); most events are open to visitors.

### Behaviour

You are expected to conduct yourself in a fitting manner, both on the course and in the clubhouse; you are responsible for your guest's conduct.

### Dress code

You should always appear neat and well dressed. Singlets, bare feet, swimwear, scuffs, thongs, stubbies, training apparel or football gear are not considered suitable whilst on the golf course. When in the clubhouse you and your guests must be suitably dressing in line with the Clubs dress regulations.

### Rules of Golf

You are expected to have a good understanding of the Rules of the Game, a free copy of which is available at the professional's shop. You are strongly advised to carry a copy with you when on the course.

If you need a ruling after a round of golf, you should contact the Captain or any other member of the Committee before lodging your scorecard.

### Rules...Responsibility

It is the duty and responsibility of the lowest handicapped player in a group of players to ensure that other members of the playing group adhere to the Rules of Golf; this includes ensuring that play progresses without due delay.

### GPS Devices

You may use measuring devices provided you only do so for measuring distance and not variables such as elevation or wind speed and direction.

### Handicaps Alterations

The Committee may approve the alteration of a member's handicap if, in absolute discretion and having regard to all the circumstances including the members results in any form of competition, it considers that the change is warranted under the Australian Handicap System.

### Honour and General Play

**In Match Play** the honour on the first tee is determined by the toss of a coin and thereafter it is determined in favour of the winner of the last won hole. From tee to holing out the honour is that of the player whose ball lies furthest from the hole.

**In Stroke Play** the first player **on the tee**, ready to play should generally assume the honour. You should mark your card at the time that ensures following players do not wait for the previous green. **Between the tee and the green**, you should move to your ball and hit when the fairway and hole ahead are clear and it is otherwise safe to do so. **On the green**, you should putt out unless you will damage someone's line of putt. In **Stableford** or **Par** events you should pick up your ball immediately you have failed to score.

### **Incorrect Marked Cards**

Incorrectly marked cards or cards not returned within thirty minutes of completion of a round will not be accepted.

### **Lightning & Suspension of Play**

You are responsible for your own personal safety on the course and it is a condition of play that you do not rely on Club Taree Golf to ensure your safety from lightning irrespective of whether the siren has been sounded for suspension of play. When there is a risk of lightning, sirens may indicate the approach of lightning: one prolonged blast of the siren indicates lightning is approaching and you should mark your ball and leave the course immediately.

### **Local Rules**

It is your responsibility to be familiar without Local Rules.

### **Loss of Position in the Field... Lost Ball**

If you lose your place in the field, you must either make up lost round without delay or call the following group through; if that is not done; the group behind may exercise their right to play through. Penalties may be applied for failing to do so.

Searching for a lost ball is not an excuse for loss of position; as soon as you think you might have some difficulty in finding a ball, call the following group through; search time for a Lost Ball is limited by Rule 18.2 to 3 minutes.

### **Motorised Vehicles**

You may use a motorised cart, tricycle, etc. in all golf events. No vehicles however are permitted inside the white lines drawn in front of and to both sides of the greens... and on any closely mown area adjacent to the greens not marked. In times of "extreme weather" carts and tricycles may be required to follow specified pathways or be prohibited entirely.

### **Protest**

If you wish to enter a protest you must do so in writing to the Committee within five days of the completion of play. The committee decision on any protest is final.

### **On-Line Booking**

You may book to play in any event up to two weeks in advance of the day of play through the player's portal on the club's website; you may also contact the club on 6552 1506.

### **Scoring Responsibilities: Competitor and Marker**

Responsibilities for scoring in stroke competition are an important part of competition. Your responsibility under Rule 3.3b as a competitor is to ensure that (1) your correct handicap is recorded on the scorecard before it is returned to the Committee, (2) the gross score on each hole is correct, (3) the marker has signed the card, and (4) you have signed the card. The card is deemed to be returned to the Committee when the card has been dropped into the box provided for the purpose.

## Method of Play... Special Events

### **Foursomes**

Foursomes is a stroke event in which partners use one ball. Each of the partners hit off from alternate tees: one hits off odd numbered tees and their partner tees off even numbered tees; in mixed foursomes the woman hits off even numbered tees. After the tee shot partners hit the ball alternately during the play of each hole until it is holed.

### **American Foursomes**

Both partners hit off and the second shot is played with their partner's ball. One ball is then selected for subsequent play and that ball is played alternately during the play of each hole.

### **Canadian Foursomes**

Both partners hit off and one ball is selected for subsequent play and that ball is played alternatively during the play of each hole.

### **Ambrose (2, 3 or 4)**

The team selects a captain, preferably the lowest marker, who determines the order of play throughout, marks the Team's card (or that of the other team if there is more than one team playing together) and decides which ball is to be played. After each shot, one ball is selected, and the other players drop their balls within one club length of the selected ball, no nearer the hole. Play continues this way until the putting green is reached where the selected ball is marked, and the others play from within 30 cm from the mark no nearer the hole; all players must putt out until it is not possible for other players to better the existing score. If a selected ball is in the rough or a hazard, the other balls must be dropped in the rough or hazard. If the selected ball lies near the putting green the ball may not be dropped or placed on the putting surface.

It is the team captain's responsibility to ensure, when playing a two person Ambrose that at least six tee shots must be recorded on the score card by each player; for three person Ambrose this is five shots and four-person Ambrose four tee shots.

### **Irish Four Ball**

This is a team event, with four (4) players. All players hole out each hole as with an individual Stableford event. On holes 1 to 6 the best single score counts as the team score... on holes 7-12 the best two scores count... on holes 13 – 18 the best three scores.

## Golf Cart Exclusion Zone

It is a condition of the use of carts that they are prohibited inside the white lines drawn in front of and to both sides of the greens... and on any closely mown areas adjacent to the greens not so marked. This applies at any time, whatever the condition of the course.

### Local Rules

These Local Rules must be read in conjunction with the Rules of Golf and any Temporary Local Rules posted in the professionals shop. The penalty for any breach of a Local Rule is the General Penalty; loss of hole in Match Play and two strokes in Stroke Play.

#### 1. Out of Bounds (Rule 18.2)

1.1 Out of bounds is defined by the line between the course-side points at ground level of white stakes with black tops and fence posts defining the boundary of the course.

You may not take free relief if your stance or swing is impeded by posts, stakes or fences that define the out of bounds.

#### 2. Abnormal Course Conditions... include Ground Under Repair (Rule 16.1)

2.1 Areas encircled by white paint. The white paint may be marked as dots, broken lines, unbroken lines or white stakes.

2.2 Areas of bare ground in the general area cut to fairway height or less, other than divots.

2.3 Clearly defined wheel ruts made by course maintenance machinery.

You may take free relief under Rule 16.1 if your ball comes to rest on or in an abnormal ground under repair whether or not that area is marked as described in 2.1. If your ball lies in a no play zone you must take relief.

#### 3. Immovable Obstructions (Rule 16.1)

3.1 All stakes defining penalty areas and ground under repair

3.2 Rocks located within penalty areas.

3.3 All roads and paths on the course, even if not artificially surfaced.

3.4 Tree Guards. IF our ball lies outside a penalty area and your stance or swing is impeded by an immovable obstruction, you **may** take (free) relief under Rule 16.1a, 16.1b, 16.1c, 16.1d, 16.1e. If your ball lies in a no play zone you **must** take relief.

3.5 Sprinkler heads on the line of play, within two club-lengths of the putting green, and within two club-lengths of the ball.

If your ball lies within two club lengths of a sprinkler head which itself is within two club lengths of the putting green and on your line of play, you may take (free) relief under Rule 16.1a, 16.1b, 16.1c, 16.1d, 16.1e.

#### 4. Integral Objects (no free relief)

4.1 All garden beds

You **must** treat all garden beds as integral objects and play your ball as it lies.

#### 5. No Play Zones (Rule 16.1f)

5.1 Trees or Shrubs identified by tree guards or white stakes.

You must take the (free) relief described in rules 16.1b, 16.1c or 16.1d when your stance or wing is impeded by trees or shrubs guarded by tree guards or markers with white stakes.

### Procedures for Suspension or Resumption of Play (Rule 5.7b):

- Dangerous conditions: signaled by one prolonged note of the siren;
- All others: signaled by three consecutive notes of the siren;
- Resumption: signaled by two short notes of the siren.

When the Committee suspends play by activating the “dangerous conditions” signal or when you believe there is danger from lightning, you **must** cease play immediately and only play another stroke when the Committee resumes play.

### Daily Conditions of Play

Any change relating to how the ball may be played, restrictions on the use of carts, application of the playing condition relating to age and handicap, or any other playing condition is indicated on the inside of the scorecard and on the Conditions of Play notice board outside the professional’s shop. The following Temporary Local Rules govern the conditions under which these special Conditions of Play apply.

Age and Handicap – the Hasham Rule.

When the condition known as the Hasham Rule is in play, the following Temporary Local Rule, together with any associated penalties, applies:

Of the total of your age and daily handicap equals 96 or more, you may hit off the red tees on the 6<sup>th</sup> and 8<sup>th</sup> holes in all club competitions.

### Preferred Lies:

When the condition known as preferred lies is in play, the following Temporary Local Rule, together any associated penalties applies

When your ball lies on closely mown areas in a part of the general area, you **may** take free relief once by placing the original ball or another ball in and playing it from this relief area:

- Reference Point: Spot of the original ball.
- Size of Relief Area Measured from Reference Point: One scorecard length or 30 cm from the reference point, but with these limits:
- Limits on Location of Relief Area:
  - Must not be nearer the hole than the reference point, and
  - Must be in the general area.

In proceeding under the Temporary Local Rule, you **must** (1) mark your ball before lifting it (See Rule 14.1); and (2) choose a spot to place the ball and use the procedures for replacing a ball under Rules 14.2b(2) and 14.2e. The penalty for playing your ball from a wrong place in breach of a Local Rule is the General Penalty under Rule 14.7a.

### Mud Adhering:

When the condition known as mud adhering is in play, the following Temporary Local Rule, together with any associate penalties applies:

When your ball lies in the general area, your ball **may** be lifted, cleaned and replaced without penalty. You **must** mark the spot before lifting the ball (see Rule 14.1) and the ball must be replaced on its original spot (see Rule 14.2). The penalty for playing your ball from a wrong place in breach of a Local Rule is the General Penalty under Rule 14.7a.
